How our repair programme works

The process is simple

Habitat's Home Repair Programme provides affordable solutions from general maintenance to essential renovations for your home.

These may include:

- Fitting curtains to create a warmer, drier home
- Repairing damaged gutters or spouting
- Installing interior rails to improve safety
- Renovating bathrooms to provide wheelchair access
- Rewiring your home to improve safety
- Building exterior disabled access
- Fitting a new roof and weather proofing your home

Complete an application form and undergo a financial assessment.



Habitat builders will access your property needs.



If your loan is successful, Habitat will undertake the necessary work.



You begin zero interest payments to Habitat.

All works large and small are considered, although cost is generally capped at \$20,000. Please do contact us to tell us your needs, as each application is considered on its own merits.
